Nova Scotia's Public Libraries: A Year in Review

In the past year, regional libraries have achieved many milestones and offered many programs and services; below are just a few highlights:

Annapolis Valley Regional Library

A new multipurpose Sprinter Bookmobile now serves rural, outlying areas and institutions. It is great for promoting library services at community events.

Cape Breton Regional Library

New projects and programs included additional Babies & Books programs and, in conjunction with community partners, a digital project, "Through Her Eves: Katharine McLennan".

Colchester-East Hants Public Library

Honouring the past, building the future, municipal and library officials are renovating and expanding the 19th century, former Normal College to become the region's central library.

Cumberland Public Libraries

Throughout the year the region began offering programs for all ages, at all locations, and saw a 20% increase in program attendance.

Eastern Counties Regional Library

Through partnerships, the Mulgrave Library was renovated and services and collections expanded in Port Hood. Member driven collection development led to a 5.5% increase in circulation.

Halifax Public Libraries

The library collection switched to RFID tags; a librarian position was created to service the Musquodoboit Valley; and Halifax Central Library is energizing the city as it takes shape.

Pictou-Antigonish Regional Library

The 10th anniversary of the Writer-in-Residence@ Library program welcomed award-winning author and storyteller, literacy advocate and UNICEF Goodwill Ambassador – Sheree Fitch.

South Shore Public Libraries

The recently opened Margaret Hennigar Public Library is providing a visible example of growth of library usage and dedication to service across the region.

Western Counties Regional Library

The WOW Reading Challenge was introduced in French to all Conseil Scolaire Acadien Provincial elementary schools in the municipalities of Clare and Argyle.
